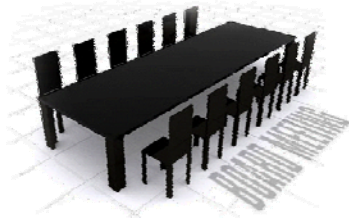

WATER CONSERVATION UPDATE

The District is in a modified version of Stage 2 of the Water Shortage Contingency plan to allow Plant #1 to be taken offline for the Water Treatment Plant Expansion Project. Information for this new watering schedule change was noted on each users billing statement, posted via banners at the North and South Gates, in front of the District office, on the District's website, posted at the Rancho Murieta Association (RMA) office, Country Store, Plaza, Subway, and Rancho Murieta Country Club.

WATER TREATMENT PLANT EXPANSION PROJECT UPDATE

Multiple tasks and meetings are convening as the project rolls forward towards the shutdown of Plant #1 and the project goes into full swing. Construction trailers for the trade contractors are set up in the staging area just outside of the WTP; stormwater erosion control measures are in place; site work has begun mainly with potholing utilities and saw cutting asphalt; drying bed expansion headwall has been poured and bed concreted, only now needing curing of concrete, drainpipes installed, and sand and gravel place; trenching began for the sewer main extension; trenching began for the 12" filtrate line around Plant #2.

WATER CONSERVATION NEWS

Water Conservation Kits

The District has free water conservation kits available to residents. The kit contains a low flow adjustable showerhead, dual thread faucet aerators for either 1.5 or 2.0 gallons per minute, dye tablets for toilet leak testing, a zip lock bag and an instruction sheet. The District also has free garden kneeling pads and sprinkler screw drivers. **Stop by and pick one up today!**

Rebates

The District offers various rebates throughout the year. Here are the ones currently available.

- **Toilet Rebate:** You can receive a rebate of up to \$100 when you purchase and install a water efficient toilet.
- **Clothes Washer:** You can receive a rebate of up to \$125 when you purchase a high-efficiency clothes washer. The overall efficiency rating of the clothes washer will determine the amount of the rebate.
- **Water Pressure Reducing Valve:** You can receive a rebate of up to \$100 when you purchase and install a water pressure reducing valve.
- **Weather Based Sprinkler Controller:** You can receive a rebate of up to \$100 when you purchase and install a weather based sprinkler controller.

LEAF RAKING TIME

When summer ends leaves change colors and drop from the trees. Raked leaves can fill the green waste containers pretty quickly. If you have more leaves and green waste than your container can handle, place the leaves in a plastic bag which is securely fastened and place alongside your gray container for regular pickup between December 1 and March 31. This additional service is provided by Cal-Waste for residents of Rancho Murieta at no additional cost.

Leaves, which get into the storm drain inlets below street level, can clog the drain pipes and result in some flooding. The District maintains these pipes, but you can help by keeping the leaves out of the streets.
